I oppose the proposal to change public charge regulation. **DHS proposes to make it more difficult for many immigrants to obtain green cards if they have medical conditions, disabilities, use federally-funded programs for food, housing or healthcare, or are too young or too old to work.** The regulation will make all immigrant families afraid to seek access to healthy food, health care, and housing, even if they aren't subject to the "public charge" test.
